



Teddy Bears Picnic - Natural Environment

Availability: Teddy Bears Picnic is available Term 3 (the best term to visit).

Teacher checklist

Pre-visit package includes:

- Preparing for a Teddy Bears Picnic
- Letter from Theodore the WEEC teddy to be read to students
- Blank name tags to print, and group students before the day
- Parent letter regarding packing an Earth Friendly lunch
- Parent helpers information

What to bring: Students to bring lunch in a lunchbox, water, hat, sunblock and a favourite teddy or soft toy in a small back pack. The school encourages recycling so minimal lunch packaging is recommended.

What to wear: Sports uniform recommended with a hat and comfortable covered shoes. Teachers and visitors will need hats and covered shoes for walking in the woodlands.

Extreme weather: The school is in an extreme weather zone and could be subjected to days above 35 degrees, high wind, dust storms or extreme fire danger. Such conditions may result in the day being modified, cancelled or postponed.

Overview

The activities provide opportunities for students to learn about the basic needs that all living things require to survive. They will learn the secret of P-A-W-S. Students will focus on people's interactions with, and responsibilities towards, living things and the environments in which they are found.

Outline of Activities

Theodore's Letter and P-A-W-S Board: The content of Theodore's letter is linked to the P-A-W-S board: P - Plants, A - Air, W - Water, S - Shelter. Things all living creatures need to survive.

Woodland Walk: Students use their senses as they walk softly through the Woodlands to investigate what plants and animals live there. Safety features of walking in the bush are discussed.

It's a Small World: Use magnifying glasses to investigate where smaller animals and insects shelter.

Listening Log and Rainbow Pieces: Sensory awareness activities encourage students to investigate their world.

Teddy Bear Tag and Musical Trees: Games and activities to reinforce P-A-W-S. Students become aware of the interaction of plants and animals in the physical environment and the need to conserve their habitats.

Lost Teddy Hunt in the Wild Woods and Teddy Bears Picnic: Students follow clues through the Wild Woods to reinforce what teddies need to survive. The clues will lead students to the Teddy Bears Picnic where they will find their teddies and lunches waiting.
